Dear President Obama,

I am writing to you once again, requesting official recognition and U.S. Secret Service protection. I cited the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations 1961, many times, as well as mentioned that I should be covered under U.S. Code and other applicable laws. A foreign head of state's dignity, whether it applies to his economic status or image before people and the world is very important and it is the Vienna Convention which protects a foreign head of state's dignity and security, as the general governing law among nations.

I need medical attention and would not mind receiving Social Security benefits, while I am in this country. And I have none at this time.

I have a bad back, from 1975 to date, due to work related injuries that Social Security has refused to cover. As of August 2010, I have two damaged knees, torn ligaments and cartilage damage\*, and due to either or both injuries (back and knee), I am permanently disabled. I have no money by which to afford medical treatments. I need an MRI, which may cost \$4,500. I, also, immediately, need dental treatments (\$4,000-\$6,000), an eye examination and thin-lens eyeglasses (\$1,800). And my present (Med-Quest) eye doctor says that I have an eye condition that may lead to my being blind (possibly within the year) and so he is treating me with Lumigan.

Where do I get money for all of these things? Is an upright Chinese emperor, one who believes in democracy, freedoms, and upright Christian values not worth the very small investment? Especially on behalf of peace and good relations between the US and China? Our country gives away trillions of dollars every year in foreign aid. Sometimes to shore up a failing democracy and sometimes to shape foreign policy. It is far cheaper to help the future head of state of a nation, one who is good and pro-democracy, one who thinks and acts as we do, rather than to later spend billions later in foreign aid to fight or deflect the adverse policies of a communist nation or to enter into an unwinnable and inhumane war.

Goodwill, now, buys our country its freedoms and insures that our nation's future will be bright. Isn't it better to think, rather than to make a mistake and suffer greatly later?

I am a guest in your nation and I am hoping that your benevolent nation would provide me with the best medical care for my temporary stay in your country.

I am currently homeless, unemployed, and disabled. I have no assets of any kind and no source of income. Your Department of Education has been harassing me in an effort to get me to shut up. Their bill collector has been hounding me for payment of my federal student loans, but I have no money by which to pay. The loan was made in good faith, but federal agents and others disrupted my education and played behavioral mindgames on me. And, now, I suffer from psychological trauma consequently. If the Department of Education wants to protect an illegally-elected President and wants to fraudulently dun me, I hope that the courts will be most fair and just and will see through this charade and punish those acting criminally in an illegal effort to protect and cover-up an illegal presidency.

I was told by other agency investigators that damages that the federal government would have to pay me, due to this continual mindgame, etc, consequently, would be far greater than the sum that I owe in student loans and so past Presidential administrations have not aggressively pursued collection activities.

My education was interrupted, when federal agents and others played a Patricia Hurst type of mindgame on me (psychological programming), and I was asked, coerced, into robbing banks as well as other Patty-Hurst-type of activities.

When will you people ever learn and when will you people ever learn to be honorable in your dealings?

I am in immediate need of housing and my privacy. My childhood doctor diagnosed me as having an allergy to dust, pollen, feathers, and animal hairs as a partial cause of my asthma. My need for housing is in the immediate and is crucial to the maintenance of my health and well-being.

I am once again asking that you do the right thing as our 44th U.S. President. Isn't it easier to do the right thing, than to spend a million or two and via an ineffective and fraudulent cover-up?

I am asking for federal money to pay for my housing and medical bills as given above in this letter. If you or any other person, the president of a nation, were in China, while I am China's president and head of state, I would provide for you and not let you or anyone so important to suffer. This is the proper protocol.

My knees have gone untreated since August 2010. It has been 6 months now, shouldn't I be given medical treatments? I am in great pain daily and my injuries are getting progressively worst!

Lastly, by the way, do you have a private and official e-mail address where foreign heads of state, VIPs like me, could send you correspondence? And it is my understanding that your former e-mail address, president@whitehouse.gov, no longer accepts e-mail from others. Not even from someone as important as the President of China or President of Russia, even in time of war. Am I correct on this matter?

Ligaments are elastic; they gradually lengthen when under tension, and return to their original shape when the tension is removed. This is in contrast with tendons, which are inelastic. However, ligaments cannot retain their original shape when stretched past a certain point or for a prolonged period of time. This is one reason why dislocated joints must be set as quickly as possible: if the ligaments lengthen too much, then the joint will be weakened, becoming prone to future dislocations.

The consequence of a broken ligament can be instability of the joint. Not all broken ligaments need surgery, but if surgery is needed to stabilise the joint, the broken ligament can be repaired. Scar tissue may prevent this. If it is not possible to fix the broken ligament, other procedures such as the Brunelli procedure can correct the instability. Instability of a joint can over time lead to wear of the cartilage and eventually to osteoarthritis.

Rehabilitation following any articular cartilage repair procedure is paramount for the success of any articular cartilage resurfacing technique. The rehabilitation is often long and demanding. The main reason is that it takes a long time for the cartilage cells to adapt and mature into repair tissue. Cartilage is a slow adapting substance. Where a muscle takes approximately 35 weeks to fully adapt itself, cartilage only undergoes 75% adaptation in 2 years.

#### Economics of MRI

MRI equipment is expensive. 1.5 tesla scanners often cost between \$1 million and \$1.5 million USD. 3.0 tesla scanners often cost between \$2 million and \$2.3 million USD. Construction of MRI suites can cost up to \$500,000 USD, or more, depending on project scope. Looking through an MRI scanner.

MRI scanners have been significant sources of revenue for healthcare providers in the US. This is because of favorable reimbursement rates from insurers and federal government programs. Insurance reimbursement

is provided in two components, an equipment charge for the actual performance of the MRI scan and professional charge for the radiologist's review of the images and/or data. In the US Northeast, an equipment charge might be \$3,500 and a professional charge might be \$350 although the actual fees received by the equipment owner and interpreting physician are often significantly less and depend on the rates negotiated with insurance companies or determined by governmental action as in the Medicare Fee Schedule. For example, an orthopedic surgery group in Illinois billed a charge of \$1,116 for a knee MRI in 2007 but the Medicare reimbursement in 2007 was only \$470.91. Many insurance companies require preapproval of an MRI procedure as a condition for coverage.

In the US, the Deficit Reduction Act of 2007 significantly reduced reimbursement rates paid by federal insurance programs for the equipment component of many scans, shifting the economic landscape. Many private insurers have followed suit.
